

**PROCLAMATION DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, working in conjunction with the Bladen County Emergency Services, the Town of Elizabethtown has been declared in a State of Emergency beginning this 7th day of October, 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, because of the path of Hurricane Matthew, it will be necessary to impose restrictions in order to maintain an acceptable level of public order and services as well as protecting lives, safety and property; and

**WHEREAS**, more specific restrictions may include imposing a curfew, possession, consumption or transfer of intoxicating liquor, transportation, transfer of dangerous weapons and substances, access to certain areas and the closing of establishments; and

**WHEREAS**, any person violating any restriction imposed by this proclamation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Town of Elizabethtown is hereby declared in a State of Emergency during Hurricane Matthew; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Council appoints Town Manager Eddie Madden in concurrence with Mayor Sylvia Campbell to impose necessary restrictions for the public safety during this storm process.

## PROCLAMATION OF CURFEW

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Elizabethtown has duly authorized the Mayor to impose various restrictions after she has determined that such restrictions are necessary as a response to an emergency;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Sylvia Campbell, Mayor of the Town of Elizabethtown, do hereby proclaim:

### I.

A state of emergency exists within the Town of Elizabethtown, North Carolina, and restrictions set forth in this proclamation are necessary in order to maintain an acceptable level of public order and services, and to protect lives and property during this emergency.

### II.

Effective, there is a CURFEW in effect from 11 p.m. until 7 a.m. on Friday, October 7, 2016 and on Saturday, October 8, 2016 from 11 p.m. until 7 a.m. on Sunday, October 9, 2016. Property owners wishing to stay in Town must stay on their property during this curfew. Individuals are not to use the public streets or right-of-ways while this proclamation is in effect.

### III.

Anyone who violates any restrictions imposed by this proclamation or under its authority violates a Town ordinance and is guilty of a misdemeanor.

### IV.

This proclamation shall take effect immediately.
